Ben & Jerry to phase out all single-use plastic utensils worldwide. The first step of the new plan is to no longer offer plastic straws or spoons beginning early this year. On April 9, 2019, Scoop Shops will complete the transition to wooden spoons and paper straws will only be available by request. The ultimate goal is to find an alternative to clear plastic cups, plastic-lined cups, and plastic lids by the end of 2020.



A sea of plastic discovered in the Caribbean, off the Honduran island of Roatan in 2017. 26-foot Pregnant Sperm Whale beached dead off the Northern coast of Sardinia after ingesting 22kg of plastic. The <u>World</u> <u>Wildlife Foundation</u> said plastic killed at least five other whales that ingested large amounts of it over the previous two years from Europe to Asia.

Shellfish eat by filtering sea water through their bodies, ingesting small particles of plastic along with their food. They accumulate massive amounts of microplastics in their tissues.



The EU voted to ban single-use plastic by 2021. MEPs backed a ban on plastic cutlery and plates, cotton buds, straws, drink-stirrers and balloon sticks. The proposal also calls for a reduction in single-use plastic for food and drink containers like plastic cups.



Ibiza is banning all disposable plastics. Ibiza and its fellow Balearic islands has passed a new legislation which will see the end of disposable plastics available for purchase by 2020.
